ENDOWMENT FUNDS

OSI Endowment Funds are permanent funds established by periodic donations whereby only the profits each year are used for the specified purpose of the fund. The principal amounts of the funds remain intact and are invested for taking the profits for specified long-term extension programmes of OSI. The endowments will ensure that their specific purposes are accomplished in perpetuity. Initially there will be two Endowments in the name of:

Dr.D.Srinivasan, Former Director of NPOL, Kochi one of the pioneers of Indian naval ocean research in India and will be called 'DS Endowment Fund' and

Prof. Tad Murthy, an eminent Canadian Scientist, who contributed to the growth of Indian Science immensely and will be called 'TAD Endowment Fund'

Both the Endowments will be used for:

- 1. To honour eminent scientists/ engineers and other professionals who have contributed to the growth of specific ocean related field. The awards shall be made once in two years commencing from the year 2019.
- 2. To institute student scholarships and fellowships depending on the returns from the Funds;
- 3. To conduct special lectures annually in the name of the two scientists.

Endowment Returns

The value of the Endowment is based on the total return from the Fund for the year. The total return includes capital appreciation (or depreciation), interest, dividends and any other income associated with the investment portfolio. Each year, a portion of the total return is made available for expenditure for the purpose of the endowment, e.g. scholarships, lectures and awards as mentioned above. Any excess return is credited to the endowment principal minus an administrative fee to help with investment, management and operational expenses. Over long periods of time, endowment values grow to keep pace with inflation and meet the established objectives of the fund.

Dr. D. SRINIVASAN AWARD

This award has been instituted to recognize outstanding and conspicuously important contribution in promoting Ocean Science and Technology and their applications by the researchers in India. The contributions should have made major impact in ocean science and/or on the use of this technology for national development.

The scientific contributions can be from the following ocean related areas:

- 1. Any area of ocean research
- 2. Development of innovative and critical technology
- 3. New design and concepts for standardization

- 4. Development of information systems and applications
- 5. Education, Training, policy development and related aspects

The award shall be given every two years and consist of Cash Prize, medal and citation.

Eligibility

Any citizen of India, engaged in activities related to Ocean Science and Technology-is eligible for this award. The prize is awarded on the basis of work primarily done in India.

Evaluation

A duly constituted Award Committee will evaluate all nominations received. The committee shall consists of:

- President, OSI (Chairman)
- Nominee of DG of DRDO/CSIR or Secretary, MoES/DST
- An Eminent expert in the field of ocean science and technology to be identified by the Governing Council, OSI.

The General Secretary of OSI will function as the Secretary of the Committee

The Committee may consider any person or persons, who in their opinion have made outstanding contributions to development of Oceanic Science and Technology for naval applications in the country, apart from those persons, whose nominations have been received. The award can be withheld in any year, if, in the opinion of the committee, no sufficient meritorious candidate is found suitable in that particular year. The decision of the Award Committee shall be final.

Presentation of the Award

The award shall be presented during the Biennial Conference of OSI (OSICON). Air fare (low cost ticket) may be reimbursed if awardee requests for it.

How to make Nomination

The nominations can be proposed by Head of a major research institute/ centre; Vice-Chancellor of a university; Secretary of Government Scientific Departments; a former Dr.D. Srinivasan Awardee, President of a National Academy, Presidents of recognised scientific or technological Societies in India, Honorary fellow or two life members of the OSI with more than 10 year old membership.

A candidate once nominated would be considered for a total period of four years. Nomination should be sent in the prescribed format to: General Secretary, Ocean society of India, Kochi.

PROF. TAD MURTHY AWARD

This award has been instituted to recognize outstanding and conspicuously important contribution in promoting **Oceanic Science and its applications in Disaster Management** in the country. The contributions should have made major impact on the use of this science or technology for national development.

The scientific contributions can be from the following ocean related areas:

- Development of innovative and critical contributions in ocean research
- New design and concepts for standardization
- Development of information systems and applications
- Education, Training, policy development and related aspects

The award shall be given every two years and consist of cash award, a medal and citation.

Eligibility

Any citizen of India, engaged in activities related to Ocean Science and Technology as applicable to disaster management is eligible for this award. The prize is awarded on the basis of work primarily done in India.

Evaluation

A duly constituted Award Committee will evaluate all nominations received. The committee shall consists of:

- President, OSI (Chairman)
- Nominee of Secretary, MoES / DST
- An Eminent expert in the field of ocean science and technology, to be identified by the Governing Council, OSI.

The General Secretary of OSI will function as the Secretary of the Committee.

The Committee may consider any person or persons, who in their opinion have made outstanding contributions to development of Oceanic Science and Technology for naval applications in the country, apart from those persons, whose nominations have been received. The award can be withheld in any year, if, in the opinion of the committee, no sufficient meritorious candidate is found suitable in that particular year.
